Student Boldly Shares His Faith!

Two weeks ago, students decided take the initiative in evangelism and go to the park to talk to people about Jesus. In order to initiate spiritual conversations with others, they used surveys that ask for others' opinions on spiritual things.

That day in the park, I (JB) went out with one of our teammates, James, and one of our students, Nick, to share our faith. Across from the bench where we'd all met sat a group of about 5-6 guys. They looked a bit intimidating—one was playing with brass knuckles, and another was dressed in a military uniform. Nick boldly said, "Let's go talk to those guys first." Our other teammate expressed a bit of hesitation. "Maybe that shouldn't be the first group we try." With no fear, Nick answered, "Why not?" And Nick walked off to start talking with the guys.

James and I, not wanting to be shown up by Nick's boldness, followed. In the end, the three of us ended up sharing Christ with 8 young men that day. We got the phone numbers of the guys who were interested in continuing to talk about spiritual things. Our conversation ended with the guys telling us that they were sorry, but they had to leave--they were late for a fight they had scheduled with some guys from another village!

The most exciting part of the day was that Nick had stepped out boldly in faith and had seen God use him. We're praying for the people who heard the Gospel that day. Perhaps even more, though, we're praying that through that day, and more like it to come, evangelism would become a way of life to the students involved in our ministry. Pray this with us!
